

PROCLAMATION

SUPPORTING THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

WHEREAS, on September 17, 1787, the Constitution of the United States of America was signed, providing a framework for our democracy and upholding the radical belief that men and women of free will have the capacity to shape their own destinies; and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States adopted in 1791 as part of the Bill of Rights protects the individual right of the people to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, the Coweta County Board of Commissioners took an oath of office to support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Georgia and reaffirm their commitment to that oath; and

WHEREAS, the Coweta County Board of Commissioners wishes to publicly express its deep commitment to the rights of all citizens of Coweta County by protecting and upholding the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Coweta County Board of Commissioners wishes to express opposition to any law that would unconstitutionally restrict the rights of the citizens of Coweta County to bear arms under the Second Amendment; and

NOW THEREFORE, the Coweta County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim support of the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution and vows to vigilantly protect the freedoms and rights guaranteed by the Constitution. Furthermore, the Board of Commissioners hereby encourages all citizens of Coweta County to support and defend their right to keep and bear arms.
