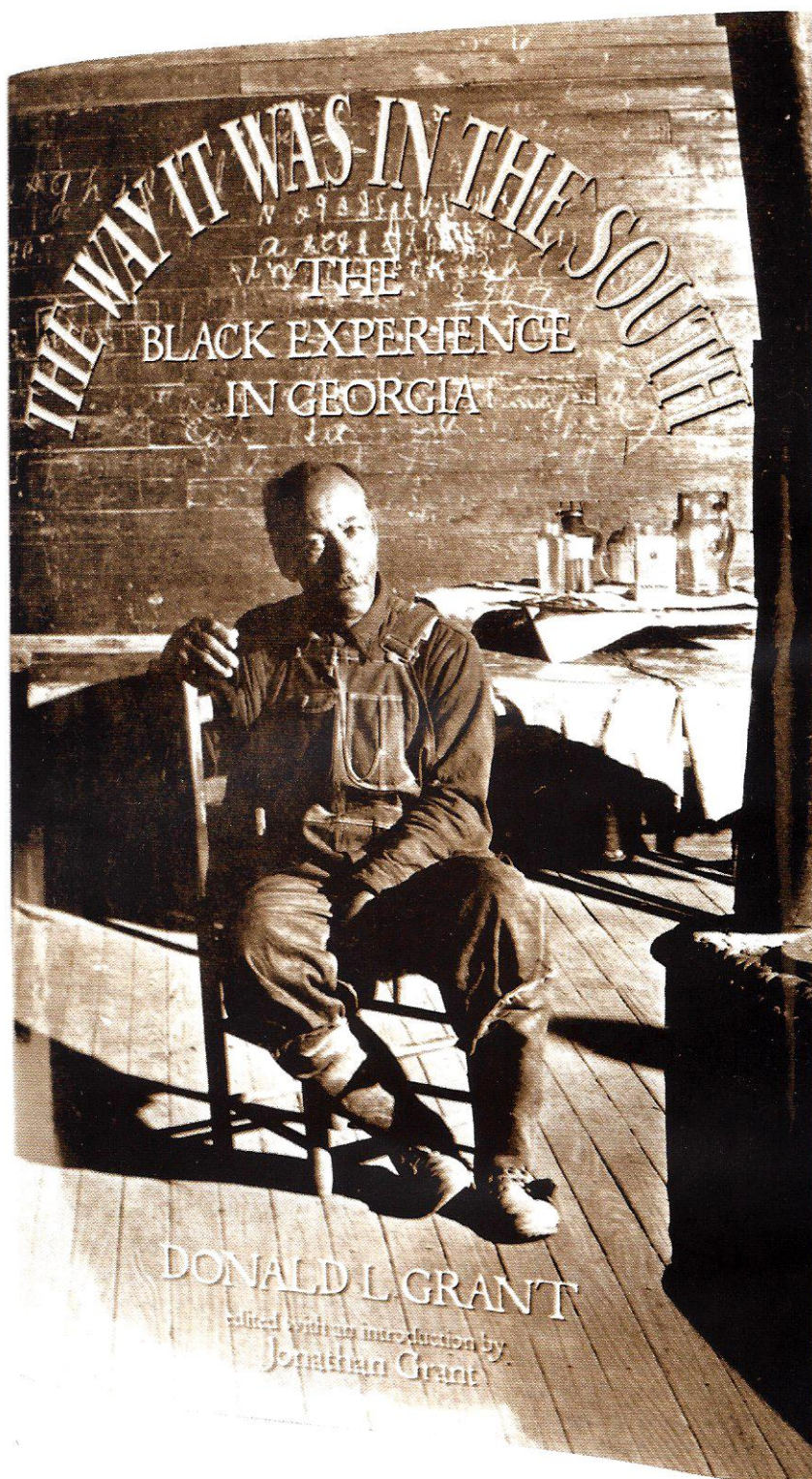


FINISHING DAD'S BOOK:
